MONTHLY SQUID REPORT SEPTEMBER

Monterey

Vessels landing in this port complex fished near the Monterey Bay Aquarium. Fishing was steady for most of the month, except for an unproductive period before and after the full moon. The average landing was 11.9 tons. Many of the squid samples were reported as spent.

Southern California

Squid fishing started in the second week of September after two months of no landings. Fish were found in good numbers off Port Hueneme and Pt. Mugu. Squid were landed in San Pedro and Ventura/Port Hueneme. Some fishermen remarked squid were at Santa Cruz Island but not in good numbers. Some captains reported water along the coast and at the islands was as warm as 69°, but squid were found when the water was 67°. The ex-vessel price was \$200-250/ton, but some speculated a drop in price when the majority of the fleet is fishing.
