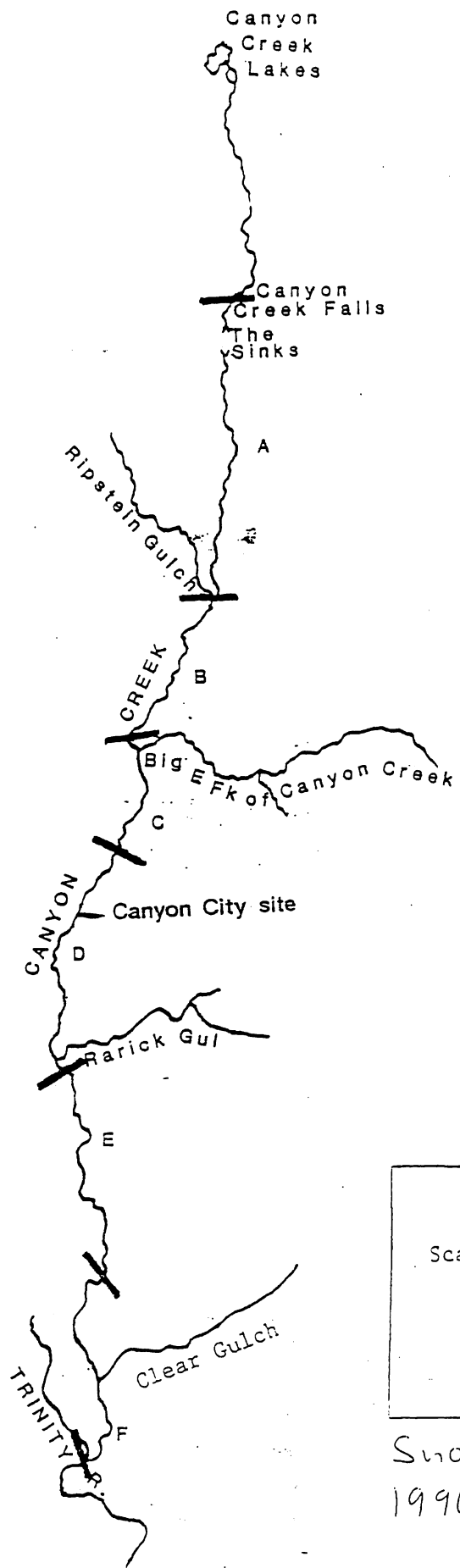
Subject: Canyon Creek Adult Summer Steelhead Survey

On August 27, 1998 Canyon Creek was surveyed for adult steelhead and spring chinook by downstream snorkeling. Eight divers counted adult fish in 13 miles of stream. Reach A was not surveyed in 1998.

Halfpounder steelhead were identified as fish between 14 and 18 inches in length. Jack chinook were fish less than 24 inches in length.
