Observations

Bull Creek was surveyed from the confluence with Cuneo Creek upstream to bridge on Bull Creek Road a distance of about 2 miles on December 23, 1987. Seven live adult chinook and one male chinook carcass were observed during the survey. The weather was clear but visibility of the water was 0-1' deep. Water temperature was 47 degrees F.

On January 22, 1988, Bull Creek was surveyed again, this time from the confluence with Cuneo Creek downstream to the mouth. Nineteen non-fresh carcasses (no clear eyes), 5 male and 7 female fresh carcasses (clear eyes) of chinook salmon were observed. Two female fresh carcasses of coho salmon were also observed. The clarity of the water during the survey was up to 2' deep, water temperature was 45 F and the weather was clear.
