Subject: Woolly Creek Summer Salmonid Survey

On August 11, 12, and 13, 1975 summer steelhead and spring run king salmon were counted in eight miles of Woolly Creek. From Big Meadows Creek to Bridge Creek all pools were checked using faceplate and snorkels. I am certain there are more steelhead and salmon below Eridge Creek but because of the time allowed counting was terminated there. Previous surveys indicated steelhead and salmon do not ascend above Big Meadows Creek.

Observed were:

N.F. Woolly Cr. to Hancock Cr.	2	16	3
Hancock Cr. to Bridge Cr.	3	39	5
Totals	8	124	13

In all the pools SH/RT up to 12 inches long were abundant. In the riffles, as determined by angling, RT/SH up to eight inches long were present in numbers sufficient to catch a limit in 0.5 hours.

The flow was estimated to be 20 cfs and the water was clear. Water temperatures at 1000 were 62° F and at 1800 they were 68° F.
