SAN FRANCISCO - Divers managed to plug the fuel vents of the capsized fishing vessel, the Deenie Lynn, to prevent it from leaking.

Parker Diving Service was able to move the vessel closer to Baker Beach, where it was safe to dive.

The Deenie Lynn overturned around midnight, and there are no signs of pollution.

The Coast Guard, and local port partners will work with the owner of the vessel to approve a final salvage plan.

No wildlife impacts have been reported, but Fish and Game responders will monitor wildlife throughout the response.
