MONTHLY MARKET SQUID REPORT October 2011



Monterey/Moss Landing

There were 19 landings of market squid in October. Fishing took place off Cordell Bank, Año Neuvo, Davenport, Watsonville, Monterey, and Soberanes Point. Landings slowed down this month as many vessels headed to southern California squid grounds. A series of weather systems and unfavorable sea conditions kept some vessels in Monterey, but by the end of the month all Monterey Port Complex vessels were in Southern California. Landed squid were mixed in size and quality. The average ex-vessel price was \$500/short ton (\$550/metric ton). Observed incidental catch included Pacific mackerel, anchovy, surf smelt, Pacific butterfish, Pacific sunfish, staghorn sculpin, Pacific sanddab, sand sole, English sole, squid egg cases, sea star, jellyfish, and kelp.

Ventura/Port Hueneme/Santa Barbara

There were 461 landings of market squid in October. Fishing took place off Morro Bay, Point Conception, Gaviota, Tajiguas, Santa Barbara, Carpenteria, Ventura, Port Hueneme, Point Mugu, Point Dume, Del Mar, Santa Rosa Island, Santa Cruz Island, Anacapa Island, and Santa Catalina Island. The average ex-vessel price was \$488/short ton (\$538/metric ton). Observed incidental catch included Pacific sardine, Pacific mackerel, jack mackerel, plainfin and specklefin midshipmen, Pacific sanddab, barracuda, white croaker, CA scorpionfish, staghorn sculpin, lingcod, bat ray, Pacific electric ray, horneyhead turbot, curlfin turbot, petrole sole, octopus, spider crab, rock crab, slender crab, sea cucumber, sea star, and kelp.

San Pedro/Terminal Island

There were 395 landings of market squid in October. Fishing took place off Morro Bay, Point Dume, Santa Monica Bay, Santa Monica Basin, Manhattan Beach, Point Fermin, Huntington Beach, San Onofre, Carlsbad, Del Mar, Mission Bay, La Jolla, Anacapa Island, Santa Catalina Island, 14 Mile Bank, San Clemente Island, 30 Fathom Spot, and 43 Fathom Spot. Fishing got off to a slow start this month due to windy weather, red tide, and a general absence of any sizeable schools of squid. Fishing picked up quickly soon after in Ventura and Los Angeles, as squid was readily available at a variety of locations along the coast. The average ex-vessel price was \$471/short ton (\$519/metric ton). Observed incidental catch included Pacific sardine, Pacific mackerel, and kelp.
