



ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

We are excited about providing a fun and educational experience for beginning level women hunters at the Central Coast Women's Pheasant Hunting Clinic. Participants will be assigned to small groups and will rotate through sessions including gun handling and safety, shooting practice on the skeet range, a field hunt (with the opportunity to take two pheasants), and hands-on game care. A barbecue lunch will be provided.

You **MUST** bring the following items:

1. 2011-2012 California hunting license or Junior hunting license
2. An upland game bird stamp on the back of your license (not needed for Junior hunters)
3. Two completed liability waiver forms (included with this letter), one for Lazy Arrow Outfitters and one for the Department of Fish and Game.
4. \$15.00 entry fee (cash or checks payable to Lazy Arrow)
5. Shooting/safety glasses. All hunters are required to wear them while in the field.
6. Warm clothing (and raingear depending on the weather)
7. Good footwear for the field
8. Shotgun (12 or 20 gauge usually recommended)
9. Pheasant rounds (#6 recommended – one box for hunting)
10. Ice chest with ice
11. You may also wish to bring a camera to record your day.

Directions to the Camatta Ranch are enclosed. The hunt will be held rain or shine.

There is a waiting list for this hunt. If your plans change and you are unable to attend the hunt, please call early so we may offer this exciting opportunity to someone else. DIRECTIONS

Camatta Ranch, Camatta Creek Road off Hwy 58, San Luis Obispo County

Driving Hwy 101 from the south: Take Hwy 101 north to the town of Santa Margarita, approximately 8.5 miles north of San Luis Obispo. Take exit 211 onto Hwy 58. Go approximately 1.5 miles, through town, then turn right to stay on Hwy 58. Watch the signs - Hwy 58 turns left after you leave town. Follow Hwy 58 for approximately 22 miles. (You will pass intersections with Hwy 229 to Creston, La Panza Road and Shell Creek Road on the way out.) Turn left on Camatta Creek Road. Plan on about a one hour drive from San Luis Obispo.

Driving Hwy 101 from the north: Take Hwy 101 south to Atascadero, approximately 10 miles south of Paso Robles. Take exit 219. Turn left onto Hwy 41 East. Go through town and continue on Hwy 41 for approximately 10 miles. Pass the turn off for Creston (Hwy 229), go over the Huerhuero Creek and turn right onto La Panza Road. Go for approximately 10 miles. At the stop sign, turn left onto Hwy 58. Go approximately 6 miles. Turn left on Camatta Creek Road. Plan on about a one hour drive from Paso Robles.

Driving Hwy 58 from the east (Carrizo Plains/Soda Lake Road): Follow Hwy 58 west approximately 20 miles past Soda Lake Road in the Carrizo Plains. Turn right onto Camatta Creek Road. Plan on about a 30 minute drive from Soda Lake Road.



**LAZY ARROW GUIDE SERVICE
PARTICIPANT AGREEMENT, RELEASE AND ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RISK**

In consideration of the services of **Lazy Arrow Guide Service**, their agents, owners, officers, volunteers, participants, employees, and all other persons or entities acting in any capacity on their behalf (hereinafter collectively referred to as "**L.A.G.S.**"), I hereby agree to release and discharge **L.A.G.S.**, on behalf of myself, my children, my parents, my heirs, assigns, personal representative and estate as follows:

1. I acknowledge that my participation in outdoor adventure based activities such as guided hunting, horseback trail rides, wagon tours, and mountain bike tours entails known and unanticipated risks which could result in physical or emotional injury, paralysis, death, or damage to myself, to property, or to third parties. I understand that such risks simply cannot be eliminated without jeopardizing the essential qualities of the activity.

Furthermore, **L.A.G.S.** guides have difficult jobs to perform. They seek safety, but they are not infallible. They might be ignorant of a participant's fitness or abilities. They might misjudge the weather, the elements, or the terrain. They may give inadequate warnings or instructions, and the equipment being used might malfunction.

2. I expressly agree and promise to accept and assume all of the risks existing in this activity. My participation in this activity is purely voluntary, and I elect to participate in spite of the risks.
3. I hereby voluntarily release, forever discharge, and agree to indemnify and hold harmless **L.A.G.S.** from any and all claims, demands, or causes of action, which are in any way connected with my participation in this activity or my use of **L.A.G.S.**'s equipment or facilities, including any such claims which allege negligent acts or omissions of **L.A.G.S.**
4. Should **L.A.G.S.** or anyone acting on their behalf, be required to incur attorney's fees and costs to enforce this agreement, I agree to indemnify and hold them harmless for all such fees and costs.
5. I certify that I have adequate insurance to cover any injury or damage I may cause or suffer while participating, or else I agree to bear the costs of such injury or damage myself. I further certify that I have no medical or physical conditions which could interfere with my safety in this activity, or else I am willing to assume – and bear the costs of – all risks that may be created, directly or indirectly, by any such condition.
6. In the event that I file a lawsuit against **L.A.G.S.**, I agree to do so solely in the state of California, and I further agree that the substantive law of that state shall apply in that action without regard to the conflict of law rules of that state.

By signing this document, I acknowledge that if anyone is hurt or property is damaged during my participation in this activity, I may be found by a court of law to have waived my right to maintain a lawsuit against **L.A.G.S.** on the basis of any claim from which I have released them herein.

I have had sufficient opportunity to read this entire document. I have read and understood it, and agree to be bound by its terms.

The Ten Commandments of Firearms Safety:

1. Watch that muzzle! Keep it pointed in a safe direction at all times.
2. Treat every firearm with the respect due a loaded gun.
3. Be sure of your target and what is in front of it and beyond it.
4. Keep your finger outside the trigger guard until ready to shoot .
5. Check your barrel and ammunition.
6. Unload firearms when not in use.
7. Point your firearm only at something you intend to shoot.
8. Don't run, jump, or climb with a loaded firearm.
9. Store firearms and ammunition separately and safely.
10. Don't drink alcohol, use drugs or take medications that might impair your abilities and good judgment before or while handling firearms or archery equipment.

READ, INITIAL AND SIGN BEFORE HUNT DAY

Waiver of Potential Claims and Release of Liability

I, _____, as a condition of my being able to participate in hunting activities on State property acknowledge and represent to the State of California each of the following:

1. Hunting is an inherently dangerous activity that can result in serious injuries or death caused by myself or other people who are present, participating in or watching such activities._____

2. Hunting also includes an inherent risk of serious injury or death caused by conditions of the land, including both defects in or improvements thereto, or natural conditions including animals (whether those being hunted or not) on the property. The State has not made any representations that the conditions of the property are suitable for hunting or that the property is free from defects._____

3. I acknowledge that in allowing me to participate in hunting activities on State property, the State owes me no duty to supervise the activity or the persons participating in or watching the activity. I further acknowledge that by providing rules, signs, guides, chaperones or other volunteers to assist in hunting activities, neither the State, its agents, employees and/or volunteers owe me any duty whatsoever to supervise or control the actions of myself or other persons participating in, watching the activity or on the property._____

4. Waiver And Release Of Claims: I hereby expressly waive any right that I might have to sue the State, its agents, employees and/or volunteers for any physical or emotional injuries, illnesses, death or other damages that I might suffer as a result of participating in hunting activities on State property._____

5. Waiver And Release Of Claims Based On Negligence: In addition to the inherent dangers involved in hunting on State property described above, I further acknowledge that serious injuries or death may be caused by the negligent acts of State employees, its agents, volunteers or other persons which increase the risk of injury beyond those normally anticipated while hunting. I hereby expressly agree to assume the risk that I may be seriously injured or killed through the negligent acts of others. I agree to waive any right I may have to sue the State, its agents, employees and/or volunteers for injuries or death that I may suffer arising out of participating in hunting or related activities including physical or emotional injuries, illnesses or death caused by the negligent acts of the State, its agents, employees, volunteers or other persons._____

Prior to executing this waiver and release of liability, I was given the opportunity to thoroughly read the entire document and to consult my own legal counsel regarding the potential effect of signing this agreement. I hereby consent to be bound by its terms and conditions.

READ, INITIAL AND SIGN BEFORE HUNT DAY

Waiver of Minor’s Potential Claims and Release of Liability

I, _____, am the legal parent/guardian of _____, a minor under the age of 18 years (the "Child"), as a condition of the Child being able to participate in hunting activities on State property, I hereby acknowledge and represent to the State of California each of the following:

1. Hunting is an inherently dangerous activity that can result in serious injuries or death caused by myself, the Child or other people who are present, participating in or watching such activities. _____ Initial

2. Hunting also includes an inherent risk of serious injury or death caused by conditions of the land, including both defects in or improvements thereto, or natural conditions including animals (whether those being hunted or not) on the property. The State has not made any representations that the conditions of the property are suitable for hunting or that the property is free from defects. _____ Initial

3. I acknowledge that in allowing the Child to participate in hunting activities on State property, the State owes the Child no duty to supervise the activity or the persons participating in or watching the activity. I further acknowledge that by providing rules, signs, guides, chaperones or other volunteers to assist in hunting activities, neither the State, its agents, employees and/or volunteers owe the Child any duty to supervise or control the actions of the Child or other persons participating in, watching the activity or on the property. _____ Initial

4. Waiver And Release Of Claims: I hereby expressly waive any right that the Child might have to sue the State, its agents, employees and/or volunteers for any physical or emotional injuries, illnesses, death or other damages that the Child might suffer as a result of participating in hunting activities on State property. _____ Initial

5. Waiver And Release Of Claims Based On Negligence: In addition to the inherent dangers involved in hunting on State property described above, I further acknowledge that serious injuries or death may be caused by the negligent acts of State employees, its agents, volunteers or other persons which increase the risk of injury beyond those normally anticipated while hunting. I hereby expressly agree that the Child assumes the risk that the Child may be seriously injured or killed through the negligent acts of others. I agree to waive any right the Child may have to sue the State, its agents, employees and/or volunteers for injuries or death that the Child may suffer arising out of participating in hunting or related activities including physical or emotional injuries, illnesses or death caused by the negligent acts of the State, its agents, employees, volunteers or other persons. _____ Initial

Prior to executing this waiver and release of liability, I was given the opportunity to thoroughly read the entire document and to consult my own legal counsel regarding the potential effect of signing this agreement. I hereby consent to be bound by its terms and conditions and consent to the Child being bound by its terms and conditions.
