## INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETING RESIDENT FALCONER RAPTOR CAPTURE REPORT

Licensees must notify the Department within five days of the take of a bird from the wild by completing this form. Contact the License and Revenue Branch at (916) 928-5849 or [spu@dfg.ca.gov](mailto:spu@dfg.ca.gov) if you need additional information regarding the reporting of raptor captures.

You must also complete and submit with this report Federal Migratory Bird Acquisition and Disposal Report (Form 3-186A) [www.fws.gov/forms/3-186a.pdf](http://www.fws.gov/forms/3-186a.pdf) and submit another copy of Form 3-186A to U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service, Migratory Bird Permit Office, 2800 Cottage Way, Room W-2606, Sacramento, CA 95825. **In addition, you must submit a copy of a topographic map, with the capture site clearly indicated, to the Department within 14 days of the take, except the map is not required when the take is of a red-tailed hawk, American kestrel or great horned owl.**

Please use UTM (Universal Transverse Mercator) Projection, including Zone, Easting and Northing when recording coordinates of the location capture site. An example of UTM in written format is as follows: UTM Zone 10; 644886E, 4301511N. Map coordinates (Latitude/Longitude) can be converted to UTM coordinates by using online conversion tools such as GEOTRANS (Geographic Translator). If a GPS unit is not used in the field, UTM's can be obtained by using online tools such as Google Earth.

1. It is mandatory to complete all items. Incomplete reports will be returned.
2. Sign and date the report.
3. Mail, fax or e-mail this completed report to the **Department of Fish and Game, License and Revenue Branch, 1740 N. Market Blvd., Sacramento, CA 95834, (916) 419-7586 or [spu@dfg.ca.gov](mailto:spu@dfg.ca.gov)**, within five days of the take. **REMINDER:** A topographic map that clearly indicates the location of the take must be submitted within 14 days of the take.

### NOTICE

Pursuant to Section 670(c)(4)(C), Title 14, of the California Code of Regulations (CCR), only the following raptors may be taken from the wild: Northern goshawk (*Accipiter gentilis*), Cooper's hawk (*Accipiter cooperii*), sharp-shinned hawk (*Accipiter striatus*), red-tailed hawk (*Buteo jamaicensis*), ferruginous hawk (*Buteo regalis*), merlin (*Falco columbarius*), American kestrel (*Falco sparverius*), prairie falcon (*Falco mexicanus*), and great horned owl (*Bubo virginianus*).

Pursuant to Section 670(c)(4)(D), Title 14, of the CCR Northern goshawks may not be taken from the wild at any time in specified portions of the Lake Tahoe Basin.
