This photograph is a sign located at Patrick's Point State Park. There are other signs prohibiting harvesting of any animals. The picture of prohibited harvesting includes mussels.







The Yurok Tribe requests some type of Environmental Impact Report recognition or analysis that natural conditions restrict harvest opportunities.

The following maps serve an as illustration of "nature preserves" created by Mother Nature within key North Coast mussel beds. We are also showing National and State Park ownership and regulatory barriers to harvesting. The generally accepted International Standard true for both low and high mussel harvesting areas is one kilometer from the access point. The Science Advisory Team marine reserve spacing requirements of 31 to 62 statute miles measured by the barrier areas insures that reproductive requirements are met within and between marine reserves. There is a high correlation between mussel beds and zero access areas. Please see the attached maps for further information.


The Yurok Tribe continues an ongoing objection to the Levels of Protection (LOP) model or decision making tree as not meeting the Marine Life Protection Act Science standards, Best Available Science (BAS) protocols, the National Research Act of 1974 and a model range of predictive variance not meeting case law evidentiary standards.





























































Minus One Tide Harvesting Chart 2011
