### ADDITIONAL INFORMATION FOR THE NELSON SLOUGH JUNIOR/WOMENS/MOBILITY IMPAIRED JUNIOR APPRENTICE PHEASANT HUNT – 2012

The Nelson Slough Unit is located 17 miles south of Yuba City and 23 miles north of Sacramento adjacent to the Feather River. Look for the Sacramento Avenue sign one mile north of the Feather River Bridge.

The hunt will start with a pre-hunt registration at 7:00 AM for the 8:00 AM hunt, or 12:00 PM for the 1:00 PM hunt. Reservations are good until 7:50 AM and 12:50 PM.

Each participant must provide the following:

- An adult that is legally responsible for the participating Junior Hunter. If the parent or guardian cannot walk with the junior hunter and they have signed the waiver included with the permit, a volunteer will accompany the junior hunter.
- A valid hunting license (adults need an upland game bird stamp).
- All shooters and non-shooters are required to wear shooting safety glasses with an ANSI rating of Z87.1 or above. Glasses are available at most sporting goods stores and will be available for loan at the check station.
- Appropriate hunting attire including thick jeans to ward off vegetation and be prepared for all weather. A blaze orange hunting vest or similar safety attire is required for all person's in the field. Orange vests are available for loan.
- For safety, hunters must have a properly fitting shotgun.
- Bring low-base or high base shot shells, size 6, or 7 1/2 shot only. No magnum loads are allowed. All hunters may have only one (1) shot shell in the magazine or chamber while hunting.
- Bring your own food and drinks, and water for your trained hunting dog.
- A good attitude and willingness to participate and follow instructions.
- Overnight parking is allowed in the main parking lot.

Please leave your weapon and dog in your vehicle until after the hunter orientation and assignment to the hunting field.





From Yuba City: Take Highway 99 South to the Sacramento Avenue exit. Go right (West) on Kirksville Road for about a mile until you come to the levee road. Turn left on the levee and follow signs to next turn. Proceed to parking lot.

From Sacramento: Take Highway 99 North to the Sacramento Avenue exit. Go left (West) on Kirksville Road for about a mile until you come to the levee road. Turn left on the levee and follow signs to the next turn. Proceed to parking lot.



#### MONITOR AND JUNIOR HUNTER SAFETY INFORMATION

The purpose of a junior hunt is to give young hunters the opportunity to hunt game in a more relaxed atmosphere and to provide them with a greater chance to bag game.

Of utmost importance is **SAFETY**. Safety is stressed at ALL times. Safety is more important than bagging game.

JUNIOR HUNTERS - Now is the time to show everything you have learned in your hunter education class!

SAFETY MONITOR - Please ask a few questions of the group:

- What do you mean by "zone of fire"?
  - o The space or area into which a hunter may safely shoot.
- In what position should you keep the firearm safety while hunting?
  - In the "on" position until you have shouldered your gun and are pointing at your target. Never put your finger on the trigger until you are ready to shoot.
  - Remember, you are the best safety. Do not rely upon the gun's safety because it could fail to work. Always keep the firearm pointed in a safe direction.
- How do you know if the firearm is loaded or unloaded?
  - You must personally check it yourself. Never take <u>any</u> person's word for it - check it yourself.
- If you stumble or fall, when you get up what is the first thing you should do?
  - o Check and make sure the gun is emptied and then check the barrel.
- When you do fall, what is the most important thing to do?
  - Hang on to your firearm to control the muzzle and make sure it is pointing in a safe direction.

The field you are going to hunt has been pre-planted with several pheasants. TAKE YOUR TIME. Pheasants love to hide. We want you to take at least an hour to make 2 passes through the field.

Be aware of where you are in relation to other in the group. STAY IN LINE!

If you, your dog, or accompanying adult get in front of the line and create a safety hazard, you will be asked to leave the field.

Your dog or dogs must be under control at all times. NO EXCEPTIONS! If your dog is not under control, the dog must be taken from the field by its handler.

REMEMBER, HAVE FUN, STAY IN LINE AND KEEP IT SAFE! GOOD LUCK!

### The Ten Commandments of Firearms Safety:

- 1. Watch that muzzle! Keep it pointed in a safe direction at all times.
  - 2. Treat every firearm with the respect due a loaded gun.
- 3. Be sure of your target and what is in front of it and beyond it.
- 4. Keep your finger outside the trigger guard until ready to shoot .
  - 5. Check your barrel and ammunition.
  - 6. Unload firearms when not in use.
  - 7. Point your firearm only at something you intend to shoot.
    - 8. Don't run, jump, or climb with a loaded firearm.
    - 9. Store firearms and ammunition separately and safely.
- 10. Don't drink alcohol, use drugs or take medications that might impair your abilities and good judgment before or while handling firearms or archery equipment.
