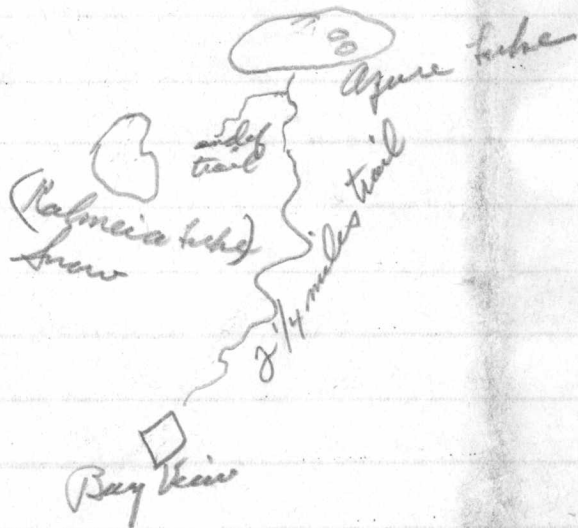
Small stream runs out part of time
