

On April 13, 1956, the Department of Fish and Game filed an application for approval of plans and specifications for construction of the Stony Ridge Lake Dam. The application set forth the estimated cost as \$9,759.85 and a fee of \$146.40 was filed with the application. It was understood that the dam had actually been constructed at the time the application was filed.

On October 3, 1957, the dam was inspected by two engineers from this office. Inspection and surveys indicated that the dam as constructed was not in accordance with either the information given on the plans or set forth in the application in many respects. However, no evidence of structural weakness could be found and the dam is considered satisfactory for approval as to safety. In view of the remote location and minor importance of the structure, no requirement for as-constructed plans will be made.

The Water Code requires, however, the filing of a statement of actual cost of construction of the dam. Presumably this cost is the same as that reported in the application. Affidavit forms for reporting this cost are attached; please submit an affidavit of the actual cost of this dam at your convenience.



On January 30 you wrote us asking for an explanation for the evident change in plans on the Stony Ridge Lake Dam.

This dam was finished in 1949. There is no one in Region II now who was connected with its construction. Our files indicate that the plans were compiled by a Mr. John S. Bass, Engineer for the Division of Water Resources. Mr. Bass supervised the construction of the dam and we suggest that you contact him for further information.
