

SURVEY NOTE:

TAYLOR CREEK

EL DORADO COUNTY

10/30/51

Observed 7 brown trout in pool below dam above Tallac Hatchery. Two actively spawning, lengths approximately 20 inches. One smaller male disturbed pair frequently. Larger pair in swift water, male approximately 24", female 26". Others smaller, 12 to 18 inches. Also several rainbow trout in pool and in pools above dam.

Temperatures: Water 58° F. Air 53° F. 10:30 A.M.

Also observed 12 to 20 rainbow trout in pool above bridge, lengths 8 to 13 inches. Often in schools of 4 or 5. One large brown trout also in pool, length approximately 20 inches. Pair of brown trout spawning just below bridge, length estimated at 15 inches.
