SUBJECT: Taylor Creek Outlet

I contacted both Jim Williamson and Glen Amundson to-day relative to doing something about the outlet of Taylor Creek. Neither of them is familiar with the creek so could not give any information about costs of the project. Mr. Williamson told me he has been making a study on creek outlets with the view of being able to set up some kind of a washing process that would assure him of a good supply of aggregates so he could have some ideas that might be worthwhile for Taylor Creek, after he has gone over the territory. He is not working right now and would be available for an inspection trip with but very little notice. His work is all done on a contract basis. Mr. Amundson started down to the mouth of Taylor Creek last Friday, having heard that some of our men were there, but arrived too late to see anyone. His present opinion is that some piling would have to be driven and sheathing bolted to the piling in order to do much good in the way of controlling sand. He says that 2" x 8"s, or any other such lumber, would be subject to considerable sucking action in any wave action and would soon free themselves and float up. He is presently engaged on a job, but, with one day's notice, would be available for an inspection trip. He prefers to work on a contract basis but will do hourly work at \$19.50 per hour, with towing charges to be half that amount on a one way trip basis.
