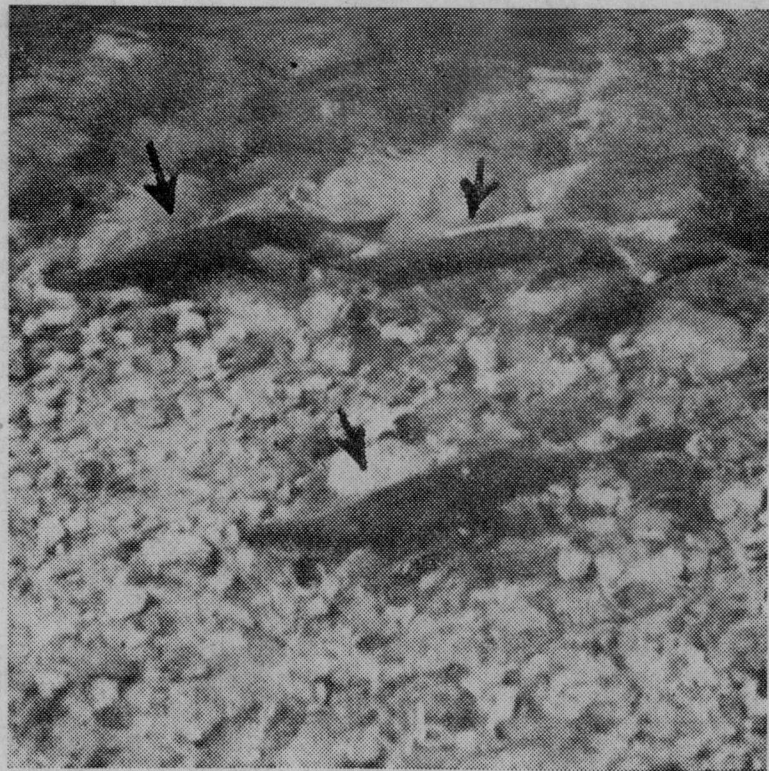

MIGRATING TO SPAWN—More than 1,000 Kokanee salmon from Lake Tahoe are presently traveling up Taylor Creek north of Camp Richardson to spawn. After laying their eggs the fish die and the young salmon make their way back to Lake Tahoe in the spring. According to Jim Leamon, state game warden, this spawning period occurs only once every four years when the salmon change to a deep red color and grow a large "hook-bill."
