On the morning of July 1, 1954, I went down to Taylor Creek, El Dorado Co., to do some fishing. I arrived at the creek at approximately 6:00 A.M. The stream was over-run by fishermen at that time.


Fishermen were standing on the bridge shoulder to shoulder the full length of the bridge on both the upstream and downstream sides. Also, fishermen were scattered above and below the bridge on both sides of the stream as far as I could see.

All available space on the old Mt. Tallac Hatchery Grounds was occupied by cars. Also, cars were parked on both sides of the road for a distance of approximately one hundred yards on both sides of the creek. I would estimate between forty and fifty cars in the immediate area of the Mt. Tallac Fish Hatchery.

In the last forty days since July 1st, I have been by Taylor Cr. three times and have seen only one fisherman. In these forty days, two of my trips by the creek have been on weekends and I did not see a single fisherman nor did I see any cars parked near by.

I hope this report will be satisfactory for your files.
