

# Trout Will Be Restored To Two Sierra Lakes

PLACERVILLE (El Dorado Co.),

Aug. 26.—Steps to restore two Sierra lakes to trout fishing have been initiated by the bureau of fish conservation of the state fish and game department with the cooperation of El Dorado Rod and Gun Club members.

Miller Lake, in Placer County, and Richardson Lake, in El Dorado County, have been treated chemically to remove the rough fish population.

Bill Berry, Phil English, Rolland Gust, Bill Holton, Howard Lewis, A. H. Murray Albert Kyburz Lloyd Raffetto and Bron Smith, of the sportsmen's club, cooperated with the bureau by providing boats and other equipment and by distributing the chemical throughout the lakes.

Only two trout were recovered in Richardson Lake, they reported, and Miller Lake yielded one large German brown trout although each lake produced thousands of chubs and suckers.

These, it was pointed out, are not native to the lakes and were carried in as bait by fishermen.

The lakes are to be restocked with trout during the 1950 planting season.
