What do we find important for recovering and sustaining healthy springs and springbrooks habitat? Ecological conditions that are found to be most critical to sustain healthy springs and springbrooks habitat in this region are:

- Area and extent
- Connectivity
- Community structure and composition

- Surface Water Flow Regime
- Ground water level

Degraded ecological conditions that are found to be impacting the springs and springbrooks habitat in this region are:

- Changes in area and extent
- Changes in community structure and composition
- Habitat fragmentation
- Changes in natural fire regime

- Changes in surface water flow regime
- Change in groundwater levels
- Changes in precipitation

Human related activities and issues that are found to be sources of potential impacts to the springs and springbrooks habitat are:

- Invasive plants/animals
- Hybridization with introduced forms
- Problematic native species
- Incompatible recreational activities
- Incompatible aquaculture practices
- Dams & incompatible water management

- Groundwater overdraft
- Renewable energy development and operations
- Commercial & industrial development
- Incompatible grazing practices
