



**GENERAL
INFORMATION**

Tehama Wildlife Area will be open to all legal public uses through Friday, October 21, 2005.

During the period October 22 through October 30, Tehama Wildlife Area will be reserved for deer hunters in possession of a valid Tehama Wildlife Area use permit. Permits will be issued by public drawing.

An application for a Tehama Wildlife Area use permit will be mailed with each zone G-1 deer tag sold. G-1 deer tag holders wishing to participate in a drawing for a permit to hunt on Tehama Wildlife Area must submit their completed application to the Department of Fish and Game by August 26, 2005.

Applications must be received at Department of Fish and Game, P. O. Box 188, Paynes Creek, California 96075 prior to 3:00 pm on August 26, 2005.

Up to six (6) hunters may apply as a party by submitting applications in one envelope. No more than one application per person may be submitted.

Use permits will be issued for two (2) hunting periods as follows:

- PERIOD 1 October 22 through October 26 (Saturday through Wednesday)
- PERIOD 2 October 27 through October 30 (Thursday through Sunday)

500 USE PERMITS will be drawn for each hunt period.

Use permits are not transferable. If reservations are not filled or if permittees drawn cannot hunt, no second drawing or replacement hunters will be allowed.

Deer hunters receiving a Tehama Wildlife Area use permit may hunt in any part of Zone C-4 where it is legal to do so.

To enter Tehama Wildlife Area during the hunt periods, persons must possess a valid, unused 2005 G-1 deer tag and a valid Tehama Wildlife Area use permit. Persons on Tehama Wildlife Area from October 21 through October 30, 2005, without a valid use permit in their possession will be in violation of Department regulations and will be subject to citation. Non-hunters accompanying permitted hunter see below.

Period 1 permit holders may enter Tehama Wildlife Area any time prior to their hunt as long as their total stay does not exceed seven (7) days at one time and 14 days in the current calendar year.

Period two permit holders may enter Tehama Wildlife Area the afternoon before their hunt period to set up camp but must remain at their camp until their permit date.

No more than one (1) non-hunter age 12 or older may accompany each permittee. Non-hunters ages 11 and under are not restricted but must be accompanied by the permit holder or his/her non-hunter. The non-hunter shall not possess or handle firearms while on the wildlife area.

Tehama Wildlife Area access roads and jeep trails leading to US Forest Service administered lands will be closed to all individuals who do not possess a valid Tehama Wildlife Area use permit during the period October 23 through October 30, 2005.

Regulations contained in Title 14, California Code of Regulations, Section 550, Wildlife Areas General, govern public used on Tehama Wildlife Area.
