REPORT OF THE 1977 GAME TAKE HUNTER SURVEY

Hunter game take questionnaires were mailed to 19,454 hunting licensees in January 1978. Two follow-up mailings were made to nonrespondents; the first approximately four weeks and the second approximately seven weeks after the initial mailing. One thousand two hundred thirty-four questionnaires were returned undelivered making a total possible response of 18,220. This was a randomly selected sample of 3.2 percent of the estimated 572,000 hunting license purchasers in 1977.

Fourteen thousand ninety-four usable questionnaires were returned; a response of 77 percent. The survey indicated that there was hunting effort by about 512,500 hunting licensees who spent some 8,357,900 days in the field.

For the past several years, follow-up mailings to nonrespondents have significantly increased response percentage. The increase in response alleviates nonresponse bias in the survey, a phenomenon based on the fact that individuals who were most successful (e.g. hunters) are more inclined to return a questionnaire than individuals who were not successful or did not participate. Nonresponse bias has been shown to be one of the principal causes of inflated bag and hunter use figures in surveys of this type. Statistical analysis of survey data now being gathered indicates a high degree of validity for species with large hunter participation.

HUNTING REGULATION CHANGES

Quail

The opening date of archery and falconry quail season was advanced from August 23 to August 13 and ended on September 5 instead of September 10.

Sierra and Ruffed Grouse

The opening date of archery and falconry Sierra and ruffed grouse was advanced from August 23 to August 13.

Turkeys

The spring turkey season was lengthened two weeks, beginning one week earlier and ending one week later than the 1976 season.

Tree Squirrels

The archery and falconry tree squirrel season was lengthened one week, beginning on August 6 instead of August 14.

Bear

Both the early and late regular bear seasons were shortened three weeks from 1976. The three week reduction was taken from the end of the season.

Ducks

The duck season in northeastern California opened and closed one week later than in 1976. The "split" between the early and late portions of the Colorado River zone season was delayed two weeks from 1976.

Geese

The goose season in northeastern California opened and closed one week later than in 1976. The "split" between the early and late portions of the Colorado River zone season was delayed two weeks from 1976. Mendocino County was dropped from those counties with no open season on Canada geese or its subspecies, and the special closure for these geese was shortened three weeks in the San Joaquin Valley.

Coots, Gallinules and Jacksnipe

The coot, gallinule and jacksnipe seasons in northeastern California opened and closed one week later than in 1976. The "split" between the early and late portions of the Colorado River zone season was delayed two weeks from 1976.

It is important to realize that there may still be statistical biases inherent in the hunter survey and the principal value of total bag figures in this report will be the indication of game bag trends. The respondents to this survey represent approximately 2.5 percent of the total hunting license buying public; consequently, those species of game which attract the smallest number of hunters tend to be more seriously affected by sampling bias. The primary use of this survey will be to compare this season with next season and in the future determination of long-range trends.

The estimated total hunting license sales divided by the number of questionnaires returned, provided the projection factor for calculating total figures. The projection factor used for the 1977 hunter survey calculations was $572,000 \div 14,094 = 41$.

Continued loss of nesting and escape cover in the principal production areas of the central valley due to clean farming and urban expansion has further eroded statewide pheasant numbers. Nineteen seventy-seven brood counts indicated overall statewide production was equal to or better than 1976 in remaining habitat. The distribution of the bag between the Sacramento and San Joaquin valleys was nearly identical to last year. The total bag decreased in proportion to the number of hunters afield.

The statewide quail bag was up slightly for all species. Late spring rains provided adequate food and cover over the majority of the state. Although water sources were reduced due to the drought, sufficient supplies remained to carry birds through the summer. Gambel's and mountain quail populations continue to remain relatively high following another good production year.

Preseason dove populations were similar to 1976. The seven percent increase in statewide harvest can be attributed primarily to the 61 percent bag increase in the counties in the northcentral and northeastern portion of the state. Hunter success was good in Modoc, Lassen, Shasta, Tehama and Butte counties.

The pigeon harvest in the coastal counties from Santa Cruz to San Diego County increased 264 percent from 1976, and was largely responsible for the 78 percent increase in statewide bag. Most Sierra Nevada counties reported bag figures below last year, probably due to the poor mast crop in that region. Pigeons were concentrated in areas with good feed, but unpredictable as usual.

The 1977-78 duck harvest was the lowest in 15 years. Results of the annual federal wing survey indicated an unusually high percentage of adult birds in the bag. Poor nesting conditions on the northern breeding grounds due to the drought resulted in fewer than normal immature ducks wintering in California, which decreased hunter success (older, experienced birds are more difficult to bag). Also, population surveys indicated many ducks overflew California to winter in Mexico where habitat conditions were more favorable.

Improved fawn survival and good buck carry-over in most herds has increased deer numbers in much of the state. The 1977 season was the best in recent years, especially in the inland zones where the bag increased 40 percent from 1976. Ideal hunting conditions during the late seasons contributed to an excellent overall year.
