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REPORT OF THE 1981 GAME TAKE HUNTER SURVEY

Hunter game take questionnaires were mailed to 21,600 hunting licensees in February 1982. Two follow-up mailings were made to nonrespondents; the first approximately four weeks and second approximately eight weeks after the initial mailing. One thousand three hundred questionnaires were returned undelivered making a total possible response of 20,300. This was a randomly selected sample of 3.8 percent of the estimated 540,000 hunting license purchasers in 1981.

Fourteen thousand six hundred and twenty-one (14,621) usable questionnaires were returned, a response of 77 percent. The survey indicated that there was hunting effort by about 551,630 hunting licensees who spent about 8,145,920 days in the field.

For the past several years, follow-up mailings to nonrespondents have significantly increased response percentage. The increase in response reduces nonresponse bias, the phenomenon of more successful individuals (e.g., hunters) being more inclined to return a questionnaire than unsuccessful or nonparticipating individuals. Nonresponse bias is one of the principal causes of inflated bag and hunter use figures in surveys of this type. However, statistical analysis of survey data indicates high validity for species pursued by large numbers of hunters.

Crow

A limit of 24 crows per day was set.

Bear

The regular bear season was extended one week.

Deer

A one week later opening of the general deer seasons

Zone X-10 - New zone was added in Tulare and Inyo counties.

Zones D-8, X-9 - Changes in boundary descriptions.

Special Hunts - The Dixie Refuge special buck hunt and the Horseshoe Ranch muzzle-loading rifle buck hunt were held for the first time this year.

#### Geese

The goose limit in Northeastern California was increased from one to two in possession for the first 14 days of the season and from 3 to 4 for the remainder of the season.

It is important to note that statistical biases are inherent in this survey and that the principal value of its bag figures is trend indication. Total respondents represent only about 3.0 percent of all hunting license buyers; consequently, those species of game which attract smaller numbers of hunters can be greatly affected by sampling bias. For all species, the use of this survey should be limited to determining long-range trends in most cases.

The estimated total hunting license sales divided by the number of questionnaires returned provides the projection factor for calculating total figures. The projection factor used for the 1981 hunter survey calculations was  $540,000 \div 14,621 = 37$ .
