**The special regulations regarding the Peninsula "U" portion of the Clear Lake National Wildlife Refuge are summarized as follows:**

Hunters will be selected through an additional public drawing process. Tag-holders for Clear Lake Zone 2 may submit an application for this drawing to the Department of Fish and Wildlife, 601 Locust Street, Redding, CA 96001. Applicants may apply as a party of two. Applications shall consist of a standard U.S. Postal Service postcard with the applicant's hunting license number, name, address, city, zip code, area code, telephone number, and the notation "Application for Pronghorn Antelope Hunt Access Permit, Clear Lake Peninsula." Applications must be received by the Redding office before the close of the business day on the first Friday in August (**August 1, 2014**). Two-party applications will not be split. Successful applicants will be notified. The area will be open on weekends and holidays only during the general season.

No more than five hunters will be allowed per day on the area, unless a party of two is drawn for the fifth place, then no more than six hunters will be allowed on the area at any time.

Successful applicants may enter the area from 6:00 a.m. to one hour after sunset at the gate entrance on the south boundary of the area located on route 136 approximately 13 miles east of the route 139 intersection.

This motorized-restricted area can be accessed by hiking, and is open weekends during the general season to selected applicants. Due to annual fluctuations in pronghorn movements, the presence or abundance of antelope occurring on the "U" can be difficult to predict. This can be an extremely rigorous hunt due to hot temperatures and long hiking distances. Hunters should be prepared with plenty of water and skilled at packing carcasses over long distances.
