LICENSED FUR TRAPPER REPORT

(1958-59 Season, Nov. 16, 1958 to February 28, 1958)
(Compiled by Game Management Branch, Sacramento)

Data for this report is compiled from reports of licensed fur trappers. Each trapper is required by law to fill out and return to the Department at the end of each trapping season a record of activities which includes the following data: Number and kinds of animals caught, county where caught, company buying the furs, and prices received for furs.

657 licenses were sold for the 1958-59 season, of which 655 were citizens and 2 were aliens. This is a decrease of twenty percent (20%) under the 1957-58 season when 823 licenses were sold. Of the 657 licenses 485 (74%) submitted reports, 172 (26%) failed to report and 184 (28%) reported they did not trap.

Trapping laws remained the same as last year except for further reduction in the restrictions on beaver trapping in certain parts of the state.

The total reported catch for the 1958-59 season was 70,543 against the total reported catch of 82,172 for the 1957-58 season, a decrease of 14.15 percent. Muskrats which accounted for 90 percent (90%) of the total catch are still in poor demand in foreign and domestic markets. The demand for bobcat showed the only marked increase with the average price approximately forty percent (40%) higher than in recent years. Some of the paler variety commanding as much as eight or nine dollars per pelt. Mink remained high and buyers still showed interest in the beaver from the counties in northeastern California.

The estimated value of the 1958-59 catch was \$71,202.00, a decrease of twenty-two percent (22%) under the 1957-58 season. The main reason for this decrease is the proportionate decrease in the number of trappers who trapped for muskrat and the continued low prices being paid for muskrat, the species caught in the most abundance.
