LICENSED FUR TRAPPERS REPORT 1960-61

Data contained in this report was obtained from trapper submitted reports received after the conclusion of the 1960-61 trapping season. State law requires that trapping reports be submitted to the Department of Fish and Game prior to July 1 following the period for which the license is issued.

A total of 543 trapping licenses were sold for the 1960-61 trapping season. The 1960-61 sale of trapping licenses was less by 7 percent than the 583 licenses sold in 1959-60.

The 1960-61 reported catch was 53,897 pelts. This was an increase of 3 percent over the 52,400 pelts reported for the 1959-60 trapping season.

Revenue received in 1960-61 as reported by trappers amounted to \$56,610.62, a decline of about 9 percent from receipts of \$62,028.76 reported for the 1959-60 trapping season.

A portion of the pelts taken each year are unsold. These pelts have a monetary value for the purpose of this report. Therefore, the estimated value of the fur catch in 1960-61 was \$60,331 compared with \$65,954 in 1959-60, a decline of about 9 percent.

In the 1960-61 trapping season muskrats continued the trend of former years as leader of California fur-bearers in both the number of pelts taken and revenue received by trappers.

The 47,303 muskrat pelts taken in the 1960-61 trapping season represented an increase of about 2 percent over the 46,175 skins reported in 1959-60. Lowered prices paid for these furs in 1960-61 caused a decline in revenues received by trappers. In 1960-61 a total of \$28,707 was paid to trappers for muskrat pelts. This was 10 percent less than the \$31,929 paid in 1959-60.
