

LICENSED FUR TRAPPERS REPORT

1972-73

A total of 682 trapping licenses was sold in the 1972-73 fur trapping season, an increase of 26.5 percent from the 539 licenses sold in 1971-72.

Success in trapping was reported by 275 trappers. This represents an increase in trapper success of 31.0 percent from 1971-72.

Revenue received by trappers from the sale of furs in 1972-73 amounted to \$145,755.38. This represents an increase of 55.1 percent above the \$94,000.60 reported for the 1971-72 season. The average income per trapper in 1972-73 was \$530.02. This is an increase of 18.4 percent from the \$447.62 per trapper in 1971-72.

Each year a portion of the fur catch is unsold. For the purpose of this report, these unsold pelts have monetary value, based on the average statewide price per pelt for each species. Therefore, the estimated value of the 1972-73 fur catch was \$150,035.79, an increase of 54.6 percent from the 1971-72 estimated value of \$97,024.42.

Muskrats, as in the past, were first on the list in number of pelts taken and revenue received. The 1972-73 reported catch of 45,175 muskrats represents 87.6 percent of the total fur catch for the season of 51,563 animals. Muskrat catch was down 1.2 percent from the catch of 52,179 reported for 1971-72. Revenue for muskrat pelts in 1972-73 was up 29.3 percent from the \$67,460.87 received by trappers in 1971-72. Average price for muskrat pelts was \$1.93, up 47.3 percent from \$1.31 in 1971-72.

The percent of other furbearers increased from 7.4 percent of the total furtake in 1971-72 to 12.4 percent in 1972-73. This represented increased take of all species except badger. The most noteable increases were increases of 160.3 and 109.2 percent in the take of fox and beaver respectively. Also, the average price per fur increased for all species. Once again the percent increase, 109.5 percent, was greatest for fox pelts. Other furs showing a marked increase in value were spotted skunk - 98.9 percent, mink - 77.6 percent, racoon - 70.4 percent, and bobcat - 55.8 percent.
