

LICENSED FUR TRAPPERS REPORT
1975-76

A total of 931 trapping licenses were sold in the 1975-76 fur trapping season. This is a decrease of 21% from the 1,172 licenses sold in 1974-75 and an increase of 6% from the 878 sold in the 1973-74 trapping season.

Legislation enacted in 1974 requires every person who now takes furbearing or nongame mammals for profit to purchase a trapping license. The fees are \$10 adult, \$5 juvenile and \$25 nonresident.

Revenue received by trappers from the sale of furs in 1975-76 based on average prices paid was \$719,431.40. This represents an increase of 155% from the \$282,104.00 reported for the 1974-75 season. The average income for successful trappers in 1975-76 was \$1,221.45. This is an increase of 78% from the \$687.00 per trapper in 1974-75.

Each year a portion of the fur catch is unsold. During the 1975-76 season 4.7% was unsold compared with 4% for the 1974-75 season. For the purpose of this report unsold pelts have the same monetary value as sold pelts. Therefore, the estimated value of the 1975-76 fur catch was \$767,436.75, an increase of 155% from the \$301,400.00 for 1974-75.

Bobcat was the most economically important pelt. This is the first time since the 1937-38 season that muskrat did not bring in the most revenue. The 2,203 bobcat taken is 58% more than last season's 1,393 and represents 2.5% of the 1975-76 catch. The average price paid for bobcat pelts was \$113.50, an increase of over 100% from the \$50.50 paid in 1974-75.

The 72,787 muskrats taken in 1975-76 represents 83.6% of the total catch and is 13% more than were taken in 1974-75. The average price paid for muskrat pelts was \$3.20, an increase of 30.6% from the 1974-75 price.

Other species of furbearers represented 14% of the total reported catch. The number of beaver, opossum and weasel were the same as in 1974-75. The numbers of the other furbearers were up from the 1974-75 season: badger 23%, coyote 35%, gray fox 102%, mink 29%, raccoon 70%, striped skunk 32% and spotted skunk 174%.

No furbearers were reported taken in Kings, Orange, San Francisco, Santa Clara and Santa Cruz counties.
