

This map illustrates the J-14 border area in Southern California. The border is marked with a thick green line. To the north, the border runs near Beaumont and Redlands, then south through Hemet, Sage, and Aguanga. It then turns east, passing near Escondido and Ramona, before heading south towards Julian and the Salton Sea. Key geographical features include the San Bernardino National Forest, Joshua Tree National Park, and several state game refuges and reservations, such as the Cahuilla, Los Coyotes, and San Felipe Valley Reservations. 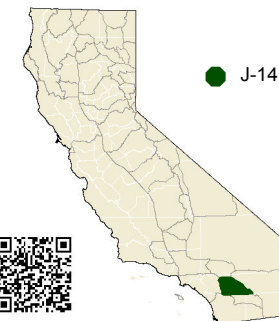
