Unified Command Responds to Outer Passage Incident

THIS IS A DRILL

Oceanside, CA - The Unified Command remains focused on the protection of people and the environment in its response to a marine vessel collision 17 miles off the coast, west of Oceanside, California.

At approximately 1:30am, the container ship Stuck Rudder and the Hamachi Voyager, a Chevron-operated oil tanker, collided, with the release of a yet to be determined quantity of crude oil.

All personnel on both vessels are currently accounted for. Three tanker crew members were injured and have been evacuated to a local hospital. Two responders en route to the response received minor injuries in a car accident. Both have been medically evaluated at a local hospital and have been discharged.

Teams of experts have been dispatched to make the area safe, identify and assess any damage, and coordinate the on-site response.
