LICENSED FUR TRAPPER REPORT
(1952-53 Season, Nov. 16 - Feb. 28)

Data for this report is derived from the reports of licensed fur trappers. Each trapper is required by law to fill out and return to the Department at the end of each trapping season a record of activities including the following data: Number and species of animals caught; county where caught; price received for furs and company buying furs.

901 trapping licenses were sold for the 1952-53 season of which 893 were citizens and 8 aliens. This is a decline of 13% from the 1951-52 season when 1,036 were sold. Of the 901 licenses 785 (87%) submitted reports, 116 (13%) failed to report and 268 (30%) indicated they did not trap.

As in the previous season the buyers demand was for the short haired fur species such as muskrat, mink, beaver, river otter and marten. However a general decline in price was noted for these species. The long haired types such as coyotes, badgers, skunks, raccoons, etc. were of low value; the buyers in some cases refusing to accept them. Many trappers reported they did not bother to skin or sell the long haired species. Sample statewide average prices received for the main species are given as follows:

*Included in average are sandrats taken in the southern part of the State which usually bring about 1/2 the price of the northern muskrats.

The past season saw a slight rise in the price received for grey fox, raccoon and skunks but demand was light and the increase was not enough to make trapping them worthwhile.

The total reported catch including all species was 91,266 for 1952-53 and 80,382 for 1951-52 an increase of 13.5%. Muskrats were taken in larger numbers the past season which accounted for the rise. The Central Valley area showed a marked increase in the muskrat catch.

The estimated total value of the fur catch for the 1952-53 season was \$104,500.00.

Attached are two tables: One gives the number of animals trapped by county and the other the average price received for furs by county.
