LICENSED FUR TRAPPER REPORT

(1955-56 Season, Nov. 16, 1955 to Feb. 28, 1956)
(Compiled by Game Management Branch, Sacramento)

Data for this report is compiled from the reports of licensed fur trappers. Each trapper is required by law to fill out and return to the Department at the end of each trapping season a record of activities including the following data: number and species of animals caught, county where caught, price received for furs, and company buying furs.

912 trapping licenses were sold for the 1955-56 season, of which 908 were citizens and 4 aliens. This is an increase of 3 percent over the 1954-55 season when 882 were sold. Of the 912 licensees, 818 (90%) submitted reports, 94 (10%) failed to report, and 297 (32%) reported they did not trap.

Trapping laws remained the same as last year, except the beaver depredations control areas were extended from northeastern California south through the Sierras to and including Alpine County. 1,780 permits were issued as a damage control measure. This accounted for the 45 percent increase in the 1955-56 beaver take.

The total reported catch was 87,581 for the 1955-56 season against the reported catch of 112,409 for 1954-55, a decrease of 28 percent. This decrease is accountable in that the heaviest rainfalls in the history of the State occurred during the height of the muskrat trapping in the Sacramento and San Joaquin Valleys. Many trappers reported they were flooded out or that they never trapped due to unprecedented high waters. A nutria was reported taken from the Merced River at its confluence with the San Joaquin.

The buyer demand has remained for the short haired fur species: muskrat, mink, otter, and beaver. A slight increase in interest was shown in raccoon and bobcat, but other long haired species such as coyote, badger, ringtail, fox, etc., drew little attention due to a continued low demand by the fur trade.

The total value of the 1955-56 fur season catch is estimated at \$100,168 - a decrease of 31 percent under the 1954-55 season. The main reason for this decrease was due to flood conditions during the trapping season.
