

SUBJECT: UPPER TRUCKEE RIVER, EL DORADO COUNTY: CREEL CENSUSES

Reference is made to your request of January 26 for available material in the survey files on the annual creel census conducted on subject stream.

It is not clear to us which of the material that is in our survey files you already have in the district survey files. There is some indication that you may already have most, if not all, of the data at hand here. Besides, it is our general policy not to send out irreplaceable material from the survey files. For these reasons I am listing the material which we have at hand. If you need any of it, please let us know, referring to the individual item by the same number noted in this letter, and we shall make up duplicate copies for you.
