SUBJECT: PLANTING ALLOTMENT FOR UPPER TRUCKEE RIVER, EL DORADO COUNTY

In Bruce Kimsey's report entitled "Upper Truckee River Creel Census, July 1, 1949" the following recommendation is listed on page 8:

In 1950 a planting of Eastern Brook be made in the Upper Truckee River from above the dairy dams to Luther Pass Bridge.

I am at fault for not having taken action on this recommendation. At this time we note that you and Mr. Pollitt have not set up any allotment for the Upper Truckee River. Please let us know whether or not you intend to do so and also your present feelings with respect to Kimsey's above recommendation.

This is in reply to your letter of April 20th concerning Bruce Kimsey's recommendation of eastern brook for the Upper Truckee River. Both Mr. Pollitt and I feel that this recommendation has considerable merit and have therefore made arrangements to plant the stream with 20,000 eastern brook from Mt. Whitney Hatchery this year. This proposed allotment appears on the Mt. Whitney Hatchery allotment list for waters in District 3. This allotment was made from Mt. Whitney Hatchery because they indicated to us that they would probably have a surplus of eastern brook, whereas Tahoe Hatchery will not have such a surplus.

If Mt. Whitney Hatchery has additional eastern brook above the 20,000 allotted, an additional 15 to 20,000 can be planted in the stream. Arrangements for planting of such additional surplus eastern brook have been discussed with Mr. Talbott.
