
SUBJECT: Agreement and Easement to Permit Fencing of Streams to
Exclude Livestock

You will recall our lack of progress in securing a suitable agreement and easement for this fencing of streams, as the Department of Finance attorneys were unable to find a permissible Code section or authority. We referred the problem to Mr. Ralph Scott of the Attorney General's Office, who recently replied indicating that he believes Section 25 of the Fish and Game Code would grant us a legal authority.

In accordance with Section 25 of the Fish and Game Code, which provides for the establishment of fish breederies, we have again drafted a document and forwarded it to the Department of Finance, requesting their approval as to form, etc. We have followed this course as it is my understanding you do not wish to renegotiate upon further findings of the Legal Branch once you are successful in signing up a landowner.

Although this project has taken considerable time, it now does appear we will have a successful agreement.
