Dear Sir:

We are planning to do some stream improvement work that will improve fishing in the Lake Tahoe area.

As you probably know, the lower seven miles of the Upper Truckee River is badly eroded and in bad shape so far as the fish are concerned. We want to obtain permission from the landowners to do some fencing, grading, and planting on the stream banks. We can't do much on this project until we talk with all the landowners concerned.

Another project we have planned is that of keeping the mouth of Taylor Creek open. Often there is a sand bar across it when kokanee salmon want to go upstream to spawn. We think that this can be prevented with some sheet piling work there.

I would like to drive up to Meyers in the near future and have a talk with you about this work. We must obtain use permits to do this work on Forest Service land and agreements with the owners of private lands where we plan to do any improving. Our plans have not reached the point where we must draw up such agreements now but we would like to get the opinions of all parties concerned before we go any further.

Would it be convenient to meet in your office sometime during the next two weeks? If so, I would appreciate your setting the date.
