SUBJECT: UPPER TRUCKEE RIVER, EL DORADO COUNTY

On November 29, 1954, Robert Montgomery and Jack Fraser appeared before the El Dorado County Board of Supervisors and presented the Department's plans for improving all tributary streams to Lake Tahoe.

The project of controlling the bank erosion on the Upper Truckee River by fencing and the project of creating a permanent channel at the Taylor Creek mouth was discussed.

At the suggestion of Supervisor Andy Robertson, the Board expressed its interest in the Department's plans and its willingness to assist the Department in carrying out these plans. Subsequently, the Board allocated \$1,000 which they indicated could be used to assist in completion of the Taylor Creek channel project and for leasing of land for the Upper Truckee River fencing project.

I gathered the general feeling that the money could be used as needed but the Board expressed one stipulation and that was that they be given the opportunity to review the bids for construction of the channel project at Taylor Creek. They indicated that they would like to review the expenditure funds for this project if the bids exceeded \$3,000 by a very wide margin.
