Dear Mr. Wilson:

May I express our appreciation for your cooperation during the recent water rights hearings before the State Water Rights Board. Your company's desire to protect the recreational fishery of the Lake Tahoe area is commendable, and we hope that it will inspire others to do likewise.

Protection of the environment for fish and wildlife is becoming more and more difficult each year, but with the cooperation of people like you and your company, we believe that it can be done. Certainly it seems necessary during the development of a recreational community like Lake Tahoe.

During the proceedings before the Water Rights Board, we spoke to Mr. Barron about the serious bank erosion problem on the Upper Truckee River. I am enclosing a brief report which explains the problem and suggests a solution. We are trying to obtain the opinion of all the land owners along the Upper Truckee on just how we can solve this problem. We should like to confer with you about it as soon as possible. Mr. Don Kelley, who represented us in the water rights hearing, has been working on this for several years and will be able to meet with you at any time or place that is most convenient for you.
