Echo Lake and Upper Truckee River

On February 28, you requested additional information about our plans for replanting the Upper Truckee River. We anticipate restocking both rainbow and brown trout in this stream, but we cannot, at this time, say when this will be done and for this reason cannot specify the numbers or size.

Echo Lake is still toxic, and we are, at present, installing a detoxification station at the outlet to render all of the outflow harmless. We expect that the spring run of rainbow trout from Lake Tahoe will enter the stream on the first high water late this month or early in April. By this time, our detoxification operation must be operating efficiently, and there must be no mistakes.

We will let you know if any spectacular ones occur.
