Temperatures in Upper Truckee River

We need to keep daily temperature records of the Upper Truckee River below Echo Creek, so that we can predict the emergence of rainbow fry now being tested there. Will you make certain that a temperature is taken in the late afternoon and in the early a.m. below the Meyers Bridge in a riffle or area where water is flowing. The temperatures could be recorded after the chlorinator is shut down for the night and before it is started in the morning. I think that whoever is running the chlorinator could safely leave it for the hour necessary to do this so long as there are others at the lake and there has been no recent shut down in the power.

It is also important to continue maintaining live cages in the Upper Truckee River. This should be done until the chlorinator is removed.
