Dear Al:

In conjunction with our proposed erosion control program on the Upper Truckee River, we would like to remove the log jams from the stream between the Highway 50 crossing above Meyers to the south boundary of Section 32, T 12 N, R 18 E. This portion of stream flows through the E $\frac{1}{2}$ of Section 31 and SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 32, T 12 N, R 18 E, practically all of which is on Forest Service property. We believe that permission to do this work could be granted under the Master Cooperative Agreement of April 15, 1953.

The South Lake Tahoe Rod and Gun Club has offered to do this work for us. The Club has a considerable amount of equipment at their disposal such as small tractors with winches and would like to use it where possible in pulling logs from the stream. A considerable portion of the job will be strictly hand work with chain saws, as we can not get equipment into several areas.

The disposal of the logs and debris will be taken care of as the Forest Service desires; probably the logs could either be piled for the use of the summer cabin owners, piled and burned during the winter, or hauled to some other disposal site.

We would like to start this work as early as possible and would appreciate a reply as soon as convenient.
