Dear Mr. Montgomery:

We are currently engaged in a sewage disposal survey for the Lake Tahoe Basin. One phase of this survey is to determine what the various streams tributary to the lake are contributing to the lake in the way of chemical and bacteriological matter. It is our understanding that the Department of Fish and Game has a stream sampling station on the Upper Truckee River near Meyers. Would it be possible for us to obtain any information you have concerning the quality and quantity of the water of the Upper Truckee, and any other streams you have under study. We are currently gaging and analyzing a number of streams in the basin, but due to the time limit of our study we are hoping that we can obtain some data which is more extensive in time than our study will permit.

We have a project office located in Tahoe Valley, and would be pleased if you would visit us if you are ever in this area. Thank you for your cooperation.

Dear Mr. Kazmierczak:

This is in reply to your letter of June 7, 1962, in which you request information on a chemical and bacteriological sampling program that the Department is reported to be conducting on the Upper Truckee River. We regret to inform you that the sampling program which is in progress near Myers on the Upper Truckee is concerned with the effect of sediment on spawning gravels and upon the aquatic insect population of the stream. Therefore, we have no water analyses which might be helpful in your studies.

In regard to quantity of flow, we are transmitting herewith a report entitled, "The Effects of Proposed Appropriation of Water from the Upper Truckee River, El Dorado County." In this report you will find daily flow records for the Upper Truckee River at Myers for 1958, 1959, and 1960. At the time the report was prepared, these records had not been published by the Department of Water Resources.

Because of the water quality in the Tahoe Basin, the Department is very much interested in your study; and we would be happy to assist you any way possible.
