Dear Mr. Stone:

This letter is to confirm that you will arrange to reduce the flow of the Truckee River for fishery management purposes in October, 1984.

The area to be studied is from Truckee to the confluence of the Little Truckee River at Boca. To facilitate the enumeration of trout in the study section, the river flow must be at minimum level. Therefore, please reduce the Truckee River at Tahoe City to 10 cfs commencing at 5:00 p.m., Sunday, October 21 and return the flow back to its normal level at noon on Thursday the 25th. During this five-day period, maintain the releases out of Donner Lake and Prosser Creek Reservoir at their normal summer levels: about 3 cfs in Donner Creek and 5 cfs in Prosser Creek.

Past experience has shown the flow in the Truckee River study area will be about 50 cfs, if the above procedure is carried out. Fifty cfs is the maximum flow at which we can conduct our studies. The late Sunday flow reduction at Tahoe City is scheduled to minimize the impact on the public's use of the river over the weekend.

The Department of Fish and Game is planning to evaluate the Truckee River fish populations on October 13-16, 1987. Prior to the work, the flow release at Tahoe City should be reduced to a minimum of 30 cfs. Minimal releases should also be made in Donner Creek and Prosser Creek.
