The Fish and Game Commission adopted hunting regulations for resident and migratory game birds at its August 6th meeting. This flyer contains a summary of the Upland Game Bird/Waterfowl Hunting Regulations for hunting seasons that occur early in the fall because regulation booklets cannot be printed and distributed before some seasons open. The Department of Fish and Wildlife has published this flyer for your convenience because it can be printed and distributed more quickly. All dates below are for the 2014/2015 hunting season.

Important Changes for 2014/2015:

- The daily bag limit for mourning and white-winged doves increased to 15 in aggregate, of which no more than 10 may be white-winged doves.

- Eurasian collared-dove season is open all year, statewide, beginning September 1.

- 30 sage-grouse permits have been approved for the North Mono Hunt Zone.

- White and dark goose daily and total bag limits increased (see below).

Canvasback bag limit reduced to 1 per day.

QUAIL HUNTING ZONE DESCRIPTIONS

Zone Q1: The early mountain quail season hunting zone includes the counties of Alpine, Butte, Del Norte, Glenn, Humboldt, Inyo, Lassen, Modoc, Mono, Plumas, Shasta, Sierra, Siskiyou, Tehama, Trinity, and those portions of Amador, Calaveras, El Dorado, Fresno, Madera, Mariposa, Nevada, Placer, Tuolumne, Tulare, and Yuba counties lying east of the western boundary of the national forests.

Zone Q2: The early coastal quail season (all species) hunting zone includes the counties of Marin, Napa, Solano, Sonoma, Lake, and Mendocino.

Zone Q3: The balance of the state season (all species) hunting zone includes the remaining land area not included in Zone Q2 (the counties of Marin, Napa, Solano, Lake, and Mendocino).

Sage-grouse hunting for general, archery, and falconry seasons by permit only. In 2014, the Fish and Game Commission authorized 30 permits for North Mono Hunt Zone only. No permits were authorized for the South Mono, East Lassen, and Central Lassen Hunt Zones. The application deadline for a sage-grouse permit is August 11.
