- Amount and product spilled: Unknown
- Location and time of spill: Alameda Marina (consists of 10 Piers), reported at 9:30 p.m.
- Cause of spill: Under investigation
- Vessel information: Unknown
- Injuries or casualties: None
- Responsible party: Unknown
- Cleanup contractors: National Response Corporation (NRC)
- Agencies responding: California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW), Office of Spill Prevention and Response (OSPR), U.S. Coast Guard, Oiled Wildlife Care Network (OWCN) and International Bird Rescue.
- Actions taken by agencies: Oil samples taken from surrounding vessels for testing at OSPR laboratories. Agencies also surveyed area for petroleum.
- Future actions: Cleanup is ongoing and samples will be tested for identification by OSPR labs.
- Public safety message: The safety of the public and incident responders is our number one priority. The public is advised to avoid contact with the oil and to keep pets on leashes away from beaches where the product has accumulated. In addition, they should not attempt to rescue oiled wildlife. Untrained individuals who attempt to rescue wildlife may cause more harm than good and may injure themselves in the process. If oiled animals are scared back into the water by pets or people, their chances of survival decrease dramatically.
