This is in reply, Mr. Schnetz ---  
--- to your letter of April 24, 1974.

Webber Creek in El Dorado County has not been stocked within the last 15 years. It supports a natural population of rainbow trout and several warmwater species.

Within the last 20 years many small streams such as Webber Creek have been dropped from the annual planting program. Surveys showed that the planting of fingerling-sized trout was unnecessary and the small stream environments were generally unsuitable for the mass recreation stimulated by the weekly planting of catchable-sized trout. In the case of Webber Creek, much of the stream flows through private lands and is thus not a good place to plant State fish.
