ORDER DECLARING A SINGLE ENTERPRISE AND UNIT
UNDER SECTION 11 OF THE WATER COMMISSION ACT

WHEREAS, the El Dorado Irrigation District has heretofore filed with the State Water Commission and the Division of Water Rights certain applications, to wit: Applications 1692, 2270 and 6138 for permits to appropriate and store waters of Webber Creek, North Fork of Cosumnes River, Camp Creek, Sly Park Creek, North Webber Creek and South Webber Creek; and

WHEREAS, the Division of Water Rights and the Division of Water Resources have approved said applications and have granted to the said district Permits 1053, 2631 and 3711 authorizing the appropriation and storage of said waters; and

WHEREAS, the said district has represented to the Division of Water Resources that the reservoirs described in said applications and permits have been surveyed and laid out, and are to be constructed, for the storage of water for a system, and that said water is to be used at one or more points under the said approved applications and permits for the appropriation of water and that said permits for the appropriation of water and rights thereunder and the reservoir sites are now held and owned by the said district; and

WHEREAS, the said district has requested the Division of Water Resources to declare such reservoirs and appropriations and rights to be and constitute a single enterprise and unit in accordance with Section 11 of the Water Commission act; and

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WHEREAS, it appears to the Division of Water Resources after due investigation that the said district has surveyed and laid out, and proposes to construct, the said reservoirs, described in said applications and permits, for the storage of water for a system, and that the water is to be used at one or more points under the said permits for the appropriation of water issued to the said district as aforesaid, and that the said permits for the appropriation of water and rights thereunder and the reservoir sites are now held and owned by the said district;

NOW THEREFORE, by virtue of the authority vested in me by Section 11 of the Water Commission Act, it is hereby declared and ordered that the said reservoirs and appropriations and rights thereunder do constitute a single enterprise and unit, and it is further declared and ordered that work of constructing said reservoirs, or any of them, or work on any one of said appropriations shall in the discretion of the Division of Water Resources be sufficient to maintain and preserve all of said applications and permits for the appropriation of water and rights thereunder; provided, that construction work described in said applications shall begin and be completed and the beneficial use of the waters to be appropriated as provided therein shall be completed in accordance with the following schedule:

SCHEDULE OF DEVELOPMENT

Complete Webber Creek Dam to a capacity of 6,000 acre feet on or before December 31, 1932.

Complete Webber Creek Dam to a capacity of 9,100 acre feet on or before December 31, 1935.

Complete South Webber Creek conduit for diversion of water from South Webber Creek on or before December 31, 1936.

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Complete conduit from Sly Park Creek (Hazel Valley Reservoir) to Webber Creek on or before December 31, 1940.

Complete Hazel Valley Reservoir Dam on Sly Park Creek and the extension of conduit from Webber Creek Reservoir to Camino Ridge on or before December 31, 1945.

Complete tunnel and conduit from Camp Creek to Hazel Valley Reservoir and conduit from North Fork of Cosumnes River on or before December 31, 1946.

Complete beneficial use of water on or before December 1, 1948.
