Dear Earl:

A committee for the Wrights Lake Summer Home Association headed by Dr. C. Walter Cole visited this office yesterday for the purpose of discussing our fish planting program for Wrights Lake, Dark Lake and other lakes in that near vicinity.

A full and open discussion was given to each waters as presented by the committee with explanation of our action and what we hoped to accomplish in the future towards the management of the fisheries problem as presented from each water.

The committee advanced the question of the planting of catchable trout stating that there had been some rumors that we had intended to bring this into the program. This rumor was not confirmed by me or anyone from this office except to state that we would like very much to carry out such a program if and when conditions permitted but that under the present set up we were not able to predict any possible foreseeable date when this could be accomplished.

At the termination of the discussion, which lasted for the greater part of an hour, the committee seemed quite satisfied with our program and were quite enthusiastic to the fact that in every incident where a water had been mentioned and survey records read them, they were in full accord with our findings. They expressed their satisfaction at the thoroughness of these survey reports and felt they had a good report to carry back to their Association meeting.

They left with the good wishes to our success and a promise of full-hearted support so far as they as individuals are concerned.
