

This lake was visited on 7/8/79. One angler fishing for 2 hours caught 3 CT; 8, 10, and 10 inches. They were in excellent condition.

This lake was formerly planted as Roddie Lake but the USFS maps name it as Hidden. To avoid further confusion, it is best to go by the designated name. It is not known where the name Roddie originated.

From 1970 through 1975 it was planted with about 800 CT-L and from 1976 to the present only in the odd years with 1,000 CT-L. This planting schedule should continue as angling pressure appears to be light at this time.


