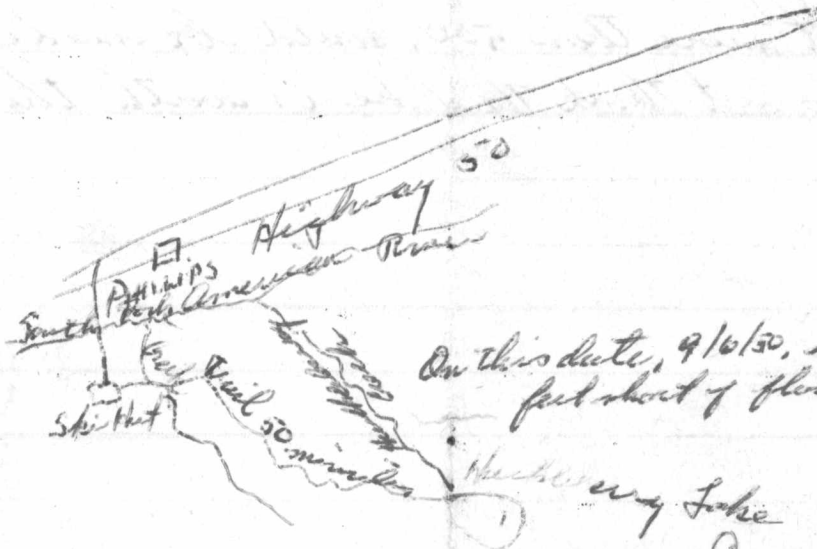
If plenty of fish are on hand, Eastern Brook, a small
