Dear Mr. Patton:

We believe your request for information on Lake Ladoga refers to East Park Reservoir. This is the nearest lake to the towns of Ladoga and Stonyford.

Some fish have been planted in East Park Reservoir. About 35,000 channel catfish weighing some 600 pounds have been planted at five locations. These fish were all fingerlings and probably will be too small to interest anglers until 1974.

We stocked some adult red-ear sunfish and crappie in March. These are seed stock for reproduction. Numbers are small and angling for them should not be encouraged. Later in the spring fingerling bass will be stocked in proper numbers to provide a good supply of fish in 1974. Here again I'm afraid they won't provide any angling in 1973. Threaffin shad will be stocked as forage in May-June.
