Subject: Hyphus Creek, Colusa County

Hyphus Creek, a small tributary to Little Stony Creek, enters the latter about a mile upstream from East Park Reservoir. The creek flows through a steep brushy canyon. Summer flows are frequently as low as 0.1 cfs. The flow in the lowermost mile of stream disappears beneath the surface during late summer. Nongame species such as suckers and squawfish are found downstream from the Mendocino National Forest boundary. A limited rainbow trout population exists from the National Forest boundary upstream to Hornet Hill, a distance of about 1.5 miles. The lower portions of Hyphus Creek (below National Forest boundary) was chemically treated on October 10, 1972, in order to facilitate treatment of East Park Reservoir.
